

**Stephen J. Flanagan** is a Senior Political Scientist at the RAND Corporation in Washington. His research interests include U.S. defense strategy, alliance and partnership relations, regional security in Europe/Eurasia and East Asia and the Pacific, strategic deterrence, and outer space security. Flanagan served in several senior positions in the U.S. government over the past 30 years including: two assignments at the National Security Council staff as Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Defense Policy (2013-5) and for Central and Eastern Europe (1997-99); Associate Director and Member of the State Department's Policy Planning Staff; National Intelligence Officer for Europe; and Professional Staff Member, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence. He also held senior research and faculty positions at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, National Defense University, the International Institute for Strategic Studies, and Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. Flanagan has published six books and many reports and journal articles on transatlantic, international security, and defense issues, and is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He earned an A.B. from Columbia Univ. and a Ph.D. from the Fletcher School, Tufts Univ.
